SUBJECT: FY 24 Motorcycle Safety Courses

1. Reference: Army Regulation 385-10

2. The Basic Motorcycle Rider Course will be available at no cost for Soldiers and Title 5 Technicians of the New York Army National Guard as follows:

Basic Rider Course

18-19 May 2024 20-21 July 2024	CAMS Motorcycle Training Hudson Valley Community College 80 Vandenburgh Avenue Troy, NY 12180
18-19 May 2024 13-14 July 2024	On the Road Again Suffolk Community College 533 College Road Selden, NY 11784
15-16 June 2024	Learn to Ride MCC Brighton Campus, Lot M-1 1000 E. Henrietta Road Rochester, NY 14623

3. Soldiers and technicians attending the course will need, at a minimum, a New York State Motorcycle Learners Permit.

4. Motorcycles will be provided for these courses. The following equipment will be furnished and worn by the Soldier or technician during the course:

- DOT approved helmet
- Eye protection (or full face helmet)
- Full fingered gloves
- Long-legged trousers
- Long sleeved shirt or jacket
- Over the ankle shoes or boots
- High visibility reflective garment or device (PT belt is acceptable)

5. Participating motorcycle schools may require negative COVD-19 test results prior to the student being accepted into the course. Procedures may vary from vendor to vendor and will be made available to the student prior to registration.

6. Soldiers and technicians are required to notify the POC listed below of the course, location and date they would like to attend this training. Soldiers will be required to submit a SF-182 for training from their unit IAW AFARS Appendix EE. Courses will be closed out 4 weeks prior to the start date of each course.

7. Soldiers and technicians who already possess a motorcycle license should contact the POC below for enrollment in intermediate or advanced motorcycle training.

8. Information on more courses for FY 24 will be posted as more dates become available.
